# Developing the ABCD Model in Leeds

## Test and Learn phase

- Neighbourhood Networks (2013-2015)
- ABCD Pathfinders running in Seacroft, New Wortley and Chapeltown (2017)

## Established ABCD Pathfinder sites

- 10 Pathfinder sites across Leeds – Carers Lens, Disability Lens, Literacy Lens

## ABCD Awareness Training and Community Builder network

- ABCD Training delivered by Touchstone to the third sector
- ABCD Community Builder network meetings



# The ABCD Community Pathfinder Grant

- One scheme will be funded in the Holbeck area, funded for 1 year.
- Three schemes will be from any of the following areas: Woodhouse, Little London, Armley, Meanwood (specifically around the Beck Hill), Moor Allerton (specifically Lingfield/Cranmer bank area) and Halton Moor. Funded for 18 months initially with an option to extend another year following that.

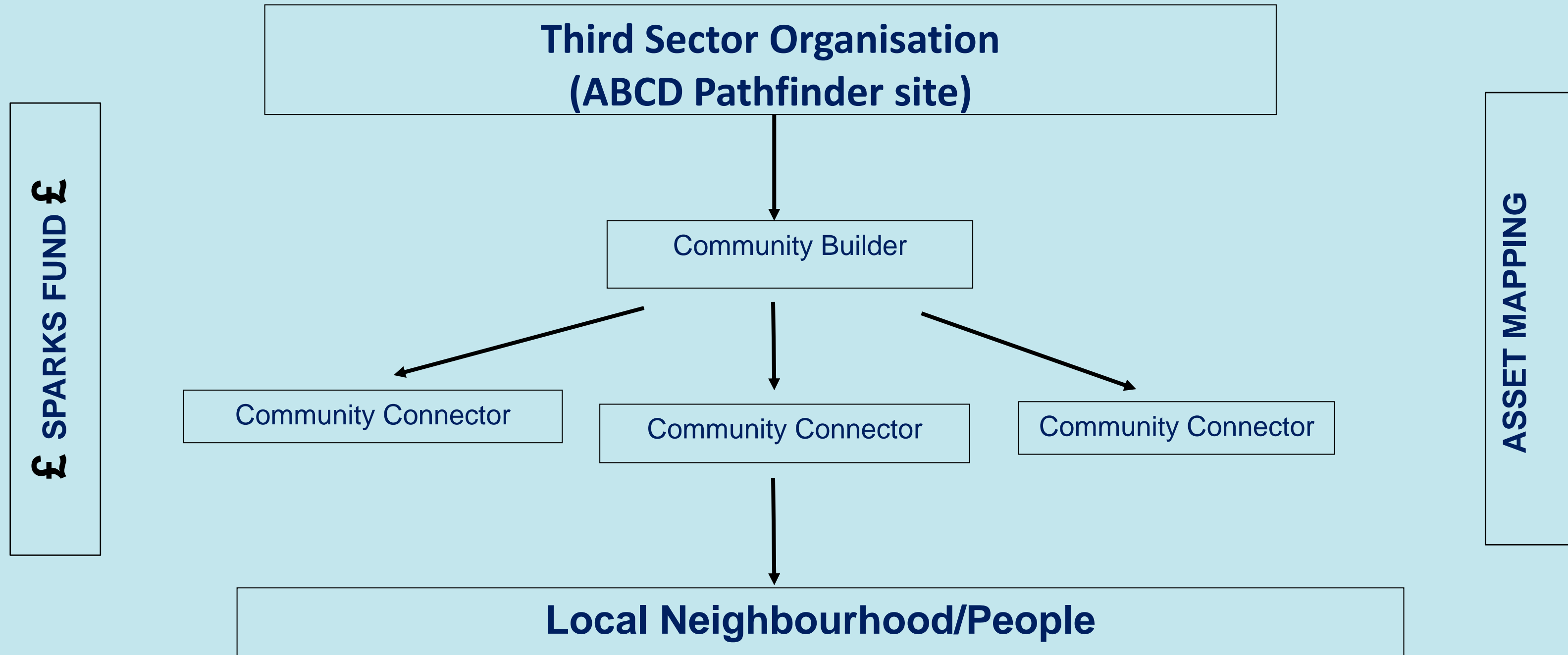


# The ABCD Community Pathfinder Grant

- One scheme will be funded with a specific focus to work with Roma communities in Leeds with the aim of improving health and well-being outcomes.
- This ABCD community pathfinder scheme will work alongside the Leeds City Council Gypsy, Roma Traveller (GRT) Inclusion Team and the Community Builder will ideally have Romanian speaking skills. This will be funded for 2 years.

# The ABCD Community Pathfinders

## Project Delivery

ABCD Pathfinders will have 2 key elements:

- A paid Community Builder post
- A Small Sparks fund of £2000



# The expected deliverables of the grant are:

- To have a paid Community Builder post in place.
- To develop 10 new community connectors (citizens living in the community who are unpaid) will be active citizens, identifying and bringing about the changes they care about and want to see.
- To develop a minimum of 10 new citizen led groups/activities established or events held in the neighbourhood and/or through social media platforms.
- To evidence how the Small Sparks money is used in the community to fund citizen's ideas.
- To embed asset-based working across the host organisation.





# What we are looking for in an application

- Evidence of working successfully with local communities.
- An understanding of the ABCD model and asset-based approaches.
- Experience and evidence of implementing and embedding change with communities.
- Evidence of working in partnership with communities, other third sector organisations and public sector bodies.
